

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How to Use the Clue Cards

This scavenger Hunt is described in detail at Free Classroom Thanksgiving Scavenger Hunt

When setting up your activity follow the steps below:

- I. Print the scavenger hunt cards.
- 2. Cut each page in half to create 2 clues/cards.
- 3. The first card is set somewhere players will easily see it or simply give it to players to start the game.
- 4. Each of the other cards are hidden around the area in a specific location. On the bottom of each card the place the card needs to be hidden is printed (upside down).
- 5. Hide the cards in each location. You can also place the picture/word card with each riddle. The matching picture is also on the riddle card, but you can use both in the classroom (similar to a Write the Room activity.) Make sure all cards are set in a safe place for players and supervise while they do the hunt.
- 6. Choose a prize or treat to place with the final clue.
- 7. Once you are fully set up, players follow the clue written on each page. Once they have a guess where each clue is leading them, they go to the location and look for their next clue.
- 8. Continue through until all the clue cards are found and players are led to the final prize/treat.
- 9. You can print the final certificate several times to give to each player along with their prize or the certificate can be the prize!


